Literacy in Civic Discourse

- Identify underlying premises or biases at work in political, social, and cultural debates, and demonstrate knowledge of the following analytical frameworks:
 - the intersectionality of race, gender, class, and sexuality;
 - o the interconnected nature of racial politics and structural inequality; and
 - the links between local, national, and global systems.

Literacy in Epistemological Methods

• Assess empirical approaches appropriate to given constructions of knowledge.

Facility in Academic Writing and Research

- Design and conduct research:
 - o develop methodologically-appropriate research questions;
 - o structure clear argumentative essays;
 - engage in reasoned analysis;
 - articulate the social significance of their research.

Historical and Conceptual Grounding

• Demonstrate knowledge of Asian American history and of the major debates of the discipline, both established and emerging.

Impact

• Articulate the values of diversity and social justice; describe the varied ways in which power is exercised, legitimized, and contested.
